Evaluation is a significant tool to segregate students as refined, average, and slow learners into courses. The college adheres strictly to the rules and regulations of Karnatak University Dharwad and follows semi-annual classes accordingly. Every teacher prepares a lesson plan and showcase for the student at the start of the academic year. In addition, a copy of that is also presented to the principal, thus periodically reviewing the coverage of the syllabus.

It is widely possible to divide the assessment as internal and external. Continuous extensive internal assessment scheme provides student's performance at a glance to the subject teacher. Regular class tests and assignment are performed to monitor the progress of the syllabus. Teachers alter their teaching and/or established learning methods for sophisticated, average, and slow students. In examinations, the institute oversees unfair means.
